Erina High School has been a hive activity over the past few weeks in terms of assessment and reporting. Semester 2 reports are well underway and will be issued to students during the last week of the term. In reading the reports it is evident that many students have worked incredibly hard to achieve their personal best and are to be congratulated on their due diligence and effort. It is pleasing to see that sheer hard work has paid off for many students and they are to feel proud of their achievement.

It is also interesting to note that many students who have not enjoyed success are often those who are unprepared for learning with no books, or equipment or whose attendance is unsatisfactory. I would strongly urge students who may be disappointed with their report to heed the advice of their Teachers and make a stronger commitment to their studies in 2012. I would appreciate parent support in encouraging their children to be well prepared for school and attend every day possible. If parents are concerned about these issues for their children please do not hesitate to contact the administration office and discuss your concerns.

The 2011 Higher School Certificate and School Certificate exams are now completed and we all eagerly await the results. I was very pleased to be advised by the presiding officer of the examinations that once again Erina High School students were well mannered and cooperative throughout the duration. Congratulations and well done students!!

Schools are in the final year of a 3 year plan and in the process of developing the next three plan. Staff at Erina High School are well underway with this process and our plan will be finalised and published on the school website before the end of the school year. The educational landscape is rapidly changing and schools need to be well prepared for the implementation of the National curriculum by 2013. This will mean a strong commitment to professional learning for our staff to ensure we are well equipped for the modifications in syllabus documents.

With the school leaving age increased there is a greater need for schools to better address the needs of students by ensuring we are providing a broad, flexible and innovative curriculum. Erina High School is well positioned with this direction with the strong focus on Vocational Education and Training, Trade Start and the introduction of courses that provide for the full range of learners.

With the abolishment of the school certificate as an exit credential schools will need to be ready to implement a new credential post year 10 and await advice from the Board of Studies as to what this may look like. It is thought that students will be provided with a credential that becomes a cumulative comprehensive record of achievement for students leaving school prior to completing year 12. Schools will be required to implement broad based assessments against external moderation standards to ensure reliability of the credential. It is envisaged that online tests in literacy and numeracy will form part of this credential that students can attempt at any point along the continuum of learning. The main thrust behind the abolishment is to encourage more students to obtain a year 12 or equivalent qualification. Research identifies that young people have improved life outcomes with higher levels of education. Early school leavers are 2 ½ times more likely to be unemployed, earn lower wages and poorer quality life outcomes.

These are a few examples of actions that will be identified in our next three year plan, in an effort to ensure we are meeting the changing educational needs of our young people to equip them for life and work in the 21st century. Watch this space as our plan takes shape!
