ENGLISH NEWS

HSC Standard and Advanced English

These HSC English courses have commenced and students are currently studying the text <u>The Simple Gift</u> as part of their Area of Study. This study requires students to develop an understanding of the concept of belonging. In doing so, students are required to examine a number of different texts and come to an informed opinion as to how all texts studied explore the concept of belonging.

In week 10 (Wednesday 14th December) students will be completing their first HSC assessment task. The task requires students to write an essay in class in 50 minutes. Students have received the essay question which is in their course booklet. This assessment task is important as it carries a weighting of 25%. Further information is available on the school website.

HSC English Studies

Students who are studying this course have an assessment task due on Thursday 1st December. This task requires students to construct an Australian Bill of Rights and compose a letter to a potential immigrant.

This is the first assessment task for this course and students have the opportunity to explore issues that concern them and our country. This assessment task is important as it carries a weighting of 30%. Further information is available on the school website.

Junior Assessment Task

Students in years 7 - 9 will be completing their final assessment task for 2011 in the coming weeks. Currently, students in these years are studying poetry. The task requires students to examine one of the poems they have studied and rewrite the poem as a narrative. Students will have two weeks to complete this task and the task is due on Wednesday 14^{th} December (Week 10). If your son / daughter will be absent from class the task will need to be submitted prior to the due date. Please see the website for further information.

Faculty Awards

Some students have been receiving English/Drama Faculty Awards for their efforts within the classroom. These awards have been selected by the teacher for excellent effort. Teachers of the students who received these awards would like to congratulate them for their efforts and appreciate the work that these students have placed into their work.

Outstanding Texts

Novels are quite expensive and are at the centre teaching in our faculty. Each year thousands of dollars in novels are not returned to the English / Drama faculty and this means that students in the following academic year miss out on new and exciting resources because money must be spent to replenish what has not been returned.

National Curriculum

After much discussion and consultation the Federal government has decided that Australia will have a National education curriculum beginning in 2013. This program will allow students from kindergarten to year 10 to travel from state to state and be taught similar material. The 2012 academic year has been set aside for schools to engage in professional discussion.

The English faculty at Erina High School have been asked by Dr David Cullen, the Senior Education Director, to run and develop pilot programs for this initiative. This is an excellent opportunity for staff and students to be involved in the direction of education for the coming years. This project involves teachers developing and creating work, based upon the National Curriculum, that will engage and excite students. Many of the programs and units of work created will then be used around the Hunter Central Coast Region, NSW and possibly Australia.

YEAR 8 ESSA TEST 2011

The Essa tests were held in the library on 22nd and 23rd of November. This was the inaugural on line testing of Science skills no paper booklet section. Students had to complete a variety of tasks to assess their skills in observation, measurement analysis of data and knowledge of Science concepts. Early reports from the students suggest the test was well received and the questions were interesting. The students enjoyed using the computers to answer the multiple choice and extended written responses.


CHANGES TO THE PARENT NEWSLETTER
