Senior students are not to leave the school grounds during study periods unless they have a note from parents seeking an early leavers pass for a genuine reason such as a medical appointment that cannot be scheduled outside of school hours. If student's lessons start after the normal school time of 9am the class Teacher will record their attendance. If they do not have scheduled lessons later in the day as per their timetable students are allowed to leave. If students arrive late for their first scheduled lesson they must get a late note from the administration office. Accurate monitoring of attendance is essential particularly in the case of an emergency so student's whereabouts can be accounted for.

There will be some timetabling changes in 2013 that will affect senior students who are now expected to attend school of a Tuesday morning for scheduled lessons and allowing Tuesday afternoon for students to attend TAFE, work or private home study. This decision has been taken to maintain the continuity of learning Monday to Friday and reduce the number of early morning starts for students. It became evident that students were finding the early morning starts difficult to attend and often arrived at varying times between 8am to 9am. This was challenging for staff to maintain teaching without disruption as well as impacted on learning as it was often disjointed with students arriving at varying times. It will also reduce the number of study periods in the week that were not being used effectively with many students choosing to leave through the day and not return if they had a class last period or choosing not to come to school if they only had one or two scheduled lessons in a day. It was also evident that students were not using their time productively of a Tuesday and feedback from parents was they would prefer to see their children actively engaged with learning 5 days a week. I am hopeful that this change may encourage students to maximise their learning opportunities and take advantage of every available opportunity to reach their personal best.

IN THE WORLD OF VISUAL ARTS

The Biennale on Cockatoo Island

Biennale is an Italian word that means an event that occurs every two years and on Wednesday the 29th August, Year 11 Visual Arts - accompanied by Mrs Scott and Mr Byrnes - visited Cockatoo Island to see the 2012 Biennale of Sydney. The exhibition consisted of contemporary art, dance and design and was all housed in the historical architecture on the island. Many artworks were touch, sound and body-heat oriented which meant we were allowed to touch and engage with the artworks. It was unlike a normal art exhibition as we were able to walk



which involved human interaction and was very technical. When you moved near it, passed by it, spoke or touched it, the artwork responded with flashing lights and counter movements. It involved the audience which was very important because we got a better understanding of the techniques used and why the artist used them. The experience of the Biennale was really enjoyable and increased our understanding of an artist's language and material practice and has helped with our preparation for HSC Visual Arts next year.

An "Altered" Environmental Installation


Year 11 Visual Arts recently enjoyed an outdoor lesson based on the art making practice of UK artist, Andy Goldsworthy. Goldsworthy is a British sculptor, photographer and environmentalist producing site-specific sculpture and land art situated in natural and urban settings. After an initial introduction to his practice, the Year 11 students took to the treed area of the playground, armed only with string and scissors, and embarked upon an artistic challenge to produce a site specific installation of their own. They were to use the natural formations in the area as well as any found objects, natural or man-made, that they could utilise in their sculpture or assemblage.



The results were some beautiful artworks that used the trees as their easel or frame, with some works being suspended, wedged in between branches or woven between entire trees.



One piece was created on objects and patterns create something akin to a






The students then documented their installations both photographically and in their sketch books as a permanent record of their work. They were asked to go and view the work later in the day after the rest of the school had been let out, to see what remained. Overall it was a thoroughly enjoyable lesson and students learnt what it is like to create impermanent artworks in an outdoor setting.

TradeStart is a DEC alternative learning program which provides an innovative and enterprising educational solution for students that provides an opportunity to work towards a qualification, receive accredited training, participate in employment generating activities and to have a pathway to further education, training and employment.

Who is eligible to enrol?

Young people who have completed a School Certificate or Certificate II in General Education or who would be eligible to go into year 11 in 2013 at school.

Currently a diverse array of students work in the program having originated from community reengagement programs, Distance Education, TAFE Certificate I courses and mainstream high schools.

What do students have to do?

Students attend TradeStart @ Green Central for a minimum of four days per week at a non-school location during school hours. Students do NOT wear a school uniform but are required to wear clothing consistent with the OH&S standard of the enterprise they will participate in.

What do students achieve?

Instead of attending year 11 at a school, students will go to TradeStart @ Green Central and over 12 months, can gain work experience and learn important vocational skills in the following enterprises:-

- Construction
- Metals and Engineering
- Hospitality
- Media
- Horticulture
- · Sustainability
- IT

• Automotive • Re

Retail

In some instances, statements of attainment and accreditations will be achieved including a Record of Achievement of preliminary HSC study units in English, Mathematics, Work Education and Sport, Lifestyle and Recreation. Students may have the opportunity to gain competencies in Retail and Hospitality and may have the opportunity to enrol in a Certificate II in Beauty Therapy (make up) course provided at TAFE.

Will students qualify for Youth Allowance?

Yes, all students are full-time.

Will there be a cost?

There are no course fees. Students will not require a uniform but will require suitable work wear. Students will be given a free travel pass to/from home to the TradeStart @ Green Central program location if they live more than 2km away. They may have to pay travel to/from any training/work held off site.

When does it begin?

There will be an open day in Term 4, 2012 with an information session that evening and the course will begin Term1, 2013. Students will have normal school holidays off.

Who is it run by?

TradeStart is run by the Department of Education and Communities with Erina High as the host school in 2013. It will be hosted by youthconnections.com.au at Green Central, Mt Penang and students requiring additional support will be case managed under the Youth Connections Program, funded by the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations. Hunter Institute of TAFE will provide accreditations in some vocational areas.


