The amount of carbohydrate present in energy drinks (e.g. 10–12 per cent) is similar to soft drinks. Following is a table that summarises the implications of excessive consumption of soft drinks:

- Displacement of healthier foods from the diet leading to poorer diet quality

#### \*caffeine-containing soft drinks

With a growing number of our students bringing these energy drinks to school to consume I am concerned about the long term affect on their health. The major constituent of energy drinks are sugar and caffeine or guarana (which contains caffeine). The major concern about energy drinks arises from their caffeine content. In general a 237 ml can of energy drink contains at least 80 mg of caffeine, with some drink sizes containing more than 300 mg. It has been reported that over-consumption of these energy drinks may even lead to death in certain circumstances. Schools have a responsibility to ensure the wellbeing and safety of all students and it is for this reason that students at EHS **are discouraged to bring and consume any energy drink to School.** I am seeking support from parents and carers to also support the school with preventing their children from bringing these energy drinks to school in the interest of student health and wellbeing.

This year the Crossroads course was delivered as a 2 day residential overnight camp at Active Outdoor Education Wyee/Morisset Centre. Conducting a residential program for Crossroads is a great way to empower students to challenge their beliefs and values away from the family and school environment, have maximum saturation of the subject matter and create an atmosphere where the genuine issues of the students can be discussed.

A great time was had by all and the students conducted themselves with maturity, co-operation and courtesy at all times and are to be commended for their fine representation of EHS.

The Outdoor activities that were successfully attempted by staff and 112 students included canoeing, flying fox, giant swing, high ropes course and initiative games. These activities further strengthened achievement of the course outcomes of decision-making, communication and risk minimisation.

Crossroads aims to support senior students as they address issues related to identity, independence and changing responsibilities. Adolescence is marked by increased exposure to a range of risks to health and well-being, including mental health problems, death or injury, exposure to drugs and problem solving. The way in which adolescents cope with these issues can have a significant impact on their future.

Students who did not attend Crossroads Camp are reminded that the completion of their booklets is mandatory for signing off of the course - without this sign off Year 11 Preliminary requirements cannot be met.


