A parent evening will also be held on the same day commencing at 6pm to provide families with as much information about Erina High School, to ensure a smooth transition into secondary schooling.

Erina High School has enjoyed the opportunity to work with our partner primary schools to deliver a stage 3 program. I would like to advise the school community that Erina High School and Woodport Public School are engaged with Gosford Council, the Department of Education and Roads and Transport in attempting to improve the traffic control between the two schools. As many of us know only too well the issue of poor parking, limited drop off points, combined with numerous bus stops and no parking or stopping signs, it is a very complex problem with the added worry of safety for our children. I will keep the school community informed of progress in this matter.

As of November 9 our school gates will be closed during the day. I am again concerned that we have unauthorised user of our car park and had a recent incident of dangerous during in the car park resulting in police action. The school car park gates will be locked from 8.45am until 3.15 Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. On Tuesdays the gates will be locked at 8.45am and opened at 2.30pm. For staff and students on a flexible timetable the gates will be open during break 2 at 1.50pm and closed at 2.30pm Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays and re-opened at 3.15pm. Authorised users of the car park that is Erina High School staff and senior students wishing to park on site will need to be aware of the opening and closing hours. This decision has been endorsed by the P&C, and supported by the staff and students at Erina High School. A reminder to families dropping students off in the morning and/or collecting in the afternoon there is a no stopping section out the front of the school, rangers regularly police this section of the road and fines are hefty. It is best to drive into the school gates before 8.45am or after 3.15pm to drop or pick up student's, or at the top of Ernest Street, Fountain Plaza or Red Rooster and allow them to walk to and from school. There is a gate at the front of the school on Central Coast Highway that is open before and after school.

We will be issuing the semester 2 reports by Monday week 11 and our annual presentation night will be held on Wednesday December 2, hope you can join in this celebration of excellent student achievement.

Whooping Cough Alert

There is an outbreak of whooping cough (pertussis) in NSW, mainly affecting school-aged children.

Coughing spreads the infection to others nearby. Whooping cough can spread to anyone at home, including younger brothers and sisters. Whooping cough can be especially dangerous for babies.

Whooping cough starts like a cold and progresses to bouts of coughing that can last for many weeks. The infection can occur even in fully-vaccinated children. Older children may just have a cough that is persistent and may be worse at night.

- Children with these symptoms should see a doctor.
- If your doctor diagnoses whooping cough in your school-aged child, please let the school know and keep your child at home until they have taken 5 days of antibiotics. Keep coughing children away from babies.
- Whooping cough vaccines give good protection against infection but immunity fades with time. Check that all your children are up to date with their vaccines, due at 6 weeks, 4 months, 6 months, 4 years and 12 years of age (offered to all Year 7 students through the NSW school-based vaccination program). A booster is also recommended at 18 months of age.

A booster dose of vaccine is also recommended for adults that are in contact with young children, such as school staff and parents. Pregnant women are recommended to have a booster dose during each pregnancy and this is funded by NSW Health. Those who are new parents or carers of babies should consult their general practitioner about appropriate immunisation.

PAYMENT OF FEES AT THE OFFICE

Welcome to all our new families. For your information and as a general reminder to all parents and students below is information on payments and office hours:

Payments may be made by cash, cheque, EFTPOS, credit card or direct deposit

The office is open to accept payments from 8.15am. Students (including Seniors) may only make payments before school commences, at Break 1 and at Break 2. The office closes at 3.30pm, therefore no payments are accepted after school.

Due to OH&S cash handling arrangements payments cannot be accepted after 2.30pm. If you find it difficult to make it to the school before 2.30pm there are a number of other options available:

- Send the payment to school with your child (cash or cheque)
- Complete a credit card payment authority to have the fees deducted from your credit account (Your child can collect one from the front office or phone the school to have one posted to you)
