English/Drama



Students have studied a variety of texts in relation to their specific topic, and will use the content learned to structure an essay that highlights a particular aspect of the focus area. Essays will be written during an allocated English lesson and students will have 50 minutes to complete this task.

A REMINDER TO PARENTS TO NOTIFY THE SCHOOL ABOUT YOUR CHILD'S HEALTH

Erina High School is currently updating student Health Care Plans and Emergency Response Plans to ensure they remain up to date with WHS and DoE requirements. If you have indicated that your child has a health concern, such as asthma or an allergy, you will be sent a letter which outlines the current documentation required by the Department of Education. Please read this information carefully. In some cases, parents will be required to provide Action Plans or supporting documentation by a doctor or a health care professional. Failure to provide the required documentation will result with a referral to the Westmead Children's Hospital Community Nurse. Students without current health care plans may be prevented from participating in some school based and extra-curricular activities.

Information about allergies, medical conditions such as asthma and diabetes and other health care related issues (including prior conditions such as medical procedures in the last 12 months) should be provided to the school by parents. Please provide this information in writing to the principal. This will greatly assist our school in planning to support your child's health and wellbeing. Please also remember to notify staff in the school office of any changes to your contact details or to the contact details of other people nominated as emergency contacts.

We appreciate your assistance in this regard and assure you that any information you provide the school will be stored securely and will only be used or disclosed in order to support your son or daughter's health needs or as otherwise required by law.

Family Assessment Consultation Education Therapy Services (FACETS) is a clinical therapy team consisting of experienced social workers, clinical psychologists and a perinatal, child and adolescent psychiatrist.

The team provides a family focused therapy service for pre-school and primary school aged children and their families, addressing concerns about the child's behaviour, emotions, social relationships and development. FACETS services are based at community health centres in Gosford (Gateway Centre), Woy Woy, Kincumber, Long Jetty, Lake Haven and Wyong Central.

FACETS offer the following services:

- information, education and advocacy for parents, carers and professionals
- comprehensive assessments to understand the needs of both the referred child and the family
- family therapy, utilising the resources of the family
- groups for children, parents and carers
- parent-child relationship therapy with a focus on attachment
- behaviour management
- child therapy
