
I BELIEVE PROGRAM




ART FACULTY

ENGLISH FACULT REPORT

Over the past couple of weeks in English, the students have continued to work hard even with the disruptions and restrictions that have been placed on the school due to COVID-19. The teachers have been supporting students in the classroom as our use of the library and computers has been restricted due to social distancing. The cooperation by everyone is very much appreciated and as a school community we have been able to maintain a stimulating learning environment and ensuring as little disruption as possible.

The students in Yrs 7 – 10 have been busy preparing their narratives for their assessment. They are to write a narrative using the context of the novel that they have been studying in class. There has been many creative pieces and the students are engaging their imagination and adding to the stories that they have read. The process has included a draft application and then a final editing process. This process creates good habits for students to critique their work and then submit their best work.

The assessment also includes an in-class component where they will need to reflect on their own ideas and construct of their stories. Again, this important in a student's learning process so they can identify their own strength and weaknesses in their writing and it also enables them to justify the choices they have made.


Our senior students are also busy preparing for assessment with support from their teachers. Yr 11 is constructing a narrative based on 'The Shifting Nature of Identity' and is the first assessment of their Stage 6 studies. Yr 12 are completing and essay for Module A: Language, Identity and Culture.

Our teachers are very well prepared if the direction is made from the school that we must teach remotely, away from school. Lessons will still be available to students and especially the support required for our senior students who are undergoing their HSC studies. We live in a connected world and we will use this to our advantage if the time comes.


