Changes for 2023

BELL TIMES: There will be a number of changes to the school day occurring in 2023. The biggest change will be that school will start at 9:00am every day, including Tuesday. The finish time will be 3:10 every day except for Tuesday which will finish at 2:45pm. We will also be removing Period A (8:00am) start for all but a very small number of senior classes. These changes will hopefully be more supportive of students and families and will allow for greater continuity of learning. An email will be sent to all families in Week 6 detailing these changes and the reasons behind the changes.

HIGH EXPECTATION: The school has begun to revisit and refocus on high expectations. There are four areas being targeted: ATTENDANCE, UNIFORM, LEARNING & BEHAVIOUR.

The school is very keen to maximise student attendance. Everyday matters, as soon as a student's attendance falls below 90% there are measurable impacts on their learning outcomes. We are striving to have as many students attending above 90% as possible.

Uniform is an area of the school that needs improvement.

The majority of students wear the school uniform well, however, a small but significant number of students are not following the expectations. The school is a "uniform school" and values the wearing of our school uniform. There will be a higher level of expectation regarding uniform from Day 1 2023 and I will be communicating this to families over the coming weeks. I am also aware financial difficulties sometimes makes the wearing of uniforms a challenge and will therefore support any student or family who needs financial assistance for this purpose. Please support the school by encouraging your child to wear school uniform every day and reinforce the message that the school cares about the expectations around wearing school uniform well.

In 2023 there will be a focus on raising expectations in learning with a strong emphasis on writing. Student effort and student responsibility in learning will also be targeted from the start of 2023. We want all students to be engaged, challenged and enjoying learning at Erina High.

EHS Principals Message Continued

The Department has implemented a new Behaviour Policy and the school is required to Develop a 'Student Behaviour and support Management Plan' for implementation prior to the end of Term 2 2023. This plan is positively based with a strong emphasis on support. We have started to communicate to students what some of these changes will mean and have launched Erina High's Core Values as the starting point for this journey.

I have included the Department's 'Behaviour Code for students' so parents can see the direction we are headed and a copy of the Core Values poster. Again, specific details will be emailed to all parents later in the term.

Behaviour code for students

NSW public schools

- Respect all property
- Not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco into our schools
- Not bully, harass, intimidate or discriminate against anyone in our schools

Schools take strong action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high quality teaching and learning.

Behaviour Code for Students: Actions

Promoting the learning, wellbeing and safety of all students in NSW Public Schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

- Take personal responsibility for behaviour and actions

- Avoid dangerous behaviour and encourage others to avoid dangerous behaviour

Engagement

- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Arrive at school and class on time
- Be prepared for every lesson
- Actively participate in learning
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments. The department provides a policy framework and resources such as Legal Issues Bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context the NSW Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.

Our Year 11 students are crossing over to Year 12. When beginning Year 12 Mathematics there's no harm in questioning why we are learning Math at all. Asking, what is the difference between a linear and a non-linear relationship, we can go deeper and ask why do we care?

Here is a quote from Wigner's infamous paper on the unreasonable effectiveness of Mathematics...

There is a story about two friends who were classmates in high school, talking about their jobs. One of them became a statistician and was working on population trends. He showed a reprint to his former classmate. The reprint started, as usual, with the normal (Gaussian) distribution and the statistician explained to his former classmate the meaning of the symbols for the actual population, for the average population, and so on. His classmate was a bit incredulous and was not quite sure whether the statistician was pulling his leg. "How can you know that?" was his query. "And what is this symbol here?" "Oh," said the statistician, "this is pi." "What is that?" "The ratio of the circumference of the circle to its diameter." "Well, now you are pushing your joke too far," said the classmate, "surely the population has nothing to do with the circumference of the circle?"

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2023 can apply now.

A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from

Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should renew or update their details before the end of term 4.

This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and entitlements remain valid for the start of the 2023 school year.

School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.
