7-10 Interim Reports



These reports give parents a basic indication of student progress across all subject areas. Staff assess students on their overall application and commitment to studies and provide a rating against predetermined performance descriptors. What's Happening in Maths

Year 7 Math students have enjoyed finding a link between encrypted images and prime numbers. All integers greater than 1 have prime factors and it is possible to multiply two prime numbers together and make a 2-dimensional grid on which to encode pictures. In fact, in 1974 an image known as the Arecibo message was sent to the Globular Cluster M13 from a Puerto Rico radio telescope carrying crude drawings of humans and DNA into outer space. EHS Mathematics students from 7E have taken the same principles to encode their own images knowing that with just a little bit of Math power they could be easily de-coded! The use of prime numbers is now ubiquitous in encrypting messages in all forms of digital communication.







English and Drama News

It is Assessment Task time in English, it is great to see our Years 7-10 students working hard in class. Students have been studying a suite of poems in class selected by their teacher and have explored the various themes and ideas represented in these poems. The Assessment Task requires them to write Narrative utilising literary techniques communicate the themes or ideas explored in the poems. Students in Years 9-10 will submit a Reflection on the due date of the Assessment Task justifying their language and stylistic choices for their Narrative composition.



Debating

We currently have Junior and Senior Debating teams training for future debates with Miss Kronja at break times.

Drama

Year 9 Drama have been working collaboratively in groups to create their first performance piece based on Fractured Fairytales. Students have been developing their play building and improvisational skills in workshops to help them refine their acting skills.

Year 10 Drama have been studying Political Theatre and developing group devised performances. They have worked collaboratively on utilising Brechtian Techniques to communicate a strong message about contemporary issues in society.

Year 11 Drama have been studying the topic Acting, Improvisation and Play building focusing on building and refining their performative skills. Their assessment task requires them to work in pairs on a duologue, students have been rehearsing their lines in class.
