Although the theory of numbers and geometry was explored by ancient civilizations around the world to very sophisticated ends, it was an Arabic book published about 1200 years ago that first used letters and numbers together in the powerful format that we still use today.

EHS Mathematics students study different techniques used to simplify, expand and factorise algebraic terms which will eventually form equations used to describe and model the world around us.




