
The Erina Learning Community consists of students, parents and carers, teaching and non-teaching staff, partner primary schools and community partners who collectively contribute to the education and development of all students.



All of Mirrabooka will return on Friday 2nd of February along with Years 8, 9 and 10.











WHAT IS PLAYSESSION

Playsession is a valuable teaching tool for our students who are undertaking studies in Early Childhood courses. Each week, the students will provide open-ended learning experiences/ and environments for the children to explore.

We have a dedicated childcare room with a lovely playground.

- Encouraging all children to develop their own creative style
- Valuing the process available at each experience rather than the end product

Your support of individual creativity and awareness of respecting each child's attempts and achievements is encouraged.

The students are assessed throughout each Playsession based on their ability to both implement planned experiences and to encourage children's involvement using a variety of strategies.

Digital media may be used for educational purposes and/or marketing. For example, when students set up a play learning environment for children, a video recording may be taken to provide them with an opportunity to reflect on and evaluate the learning
