Mobile Phone ban commencing Term 4 – canteen purchases

As you are aware, students will not be able to access their mobile phones whilst at school from Term 4. One of the impacts of this ban is students will not be able to use their phones to buy food from the canteen. Students will need to pay for food using cash or use a debit card. This will be a significant change for many as a large number of students do use their phones for this purpose.

This challenge, saw our students dedicate themselves to exploring innovative solutions that would foster resilient and sustainable environments in Lake Macquarie. They embraced the task with unwavering determination, addressing specific challenges that were intricately tied to the selected location.

Innovation to improve our infrastructure and environment led to the development of 'Eco-Murals' which aimed to reduced carbon dioxide in the town's most heavy populated areas. The girls should be commended on their efforts, teamwork and grit over the competition. Well done!






